- any other Savalas memorabilia

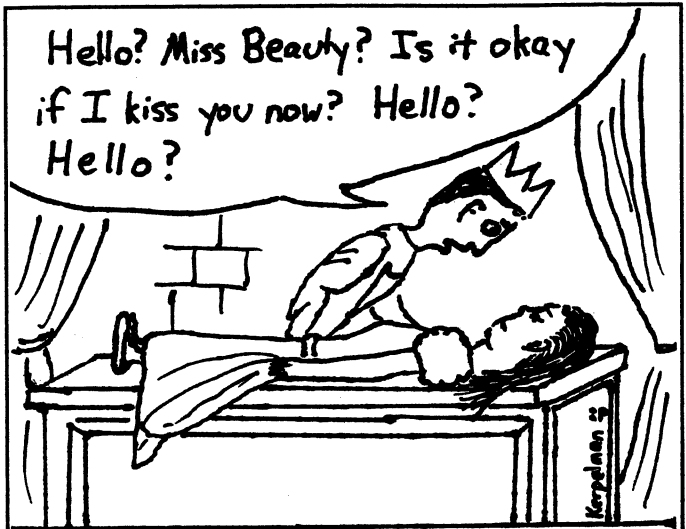
In "Newspaper," it is acceptable to include:

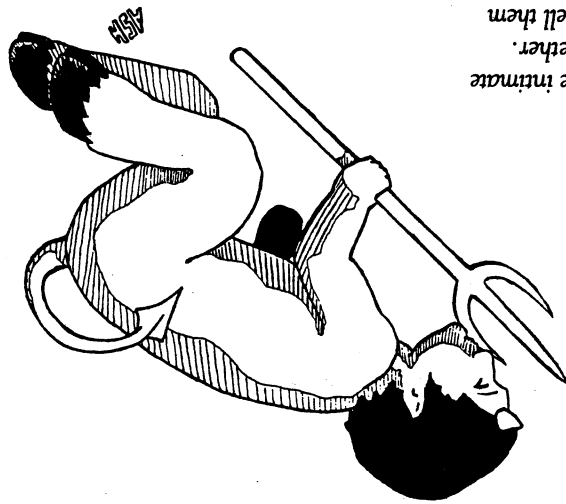

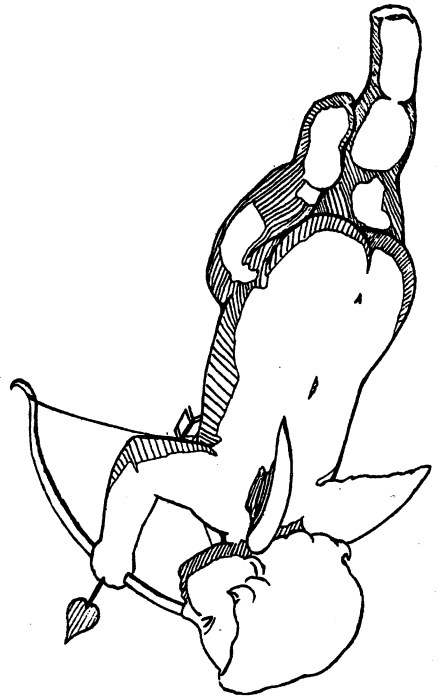
