2 The short story, "No Man's Land," was accidentally published in *The New Yorker* and not here in the *Record*. We apologize for this unfortunate oversight.

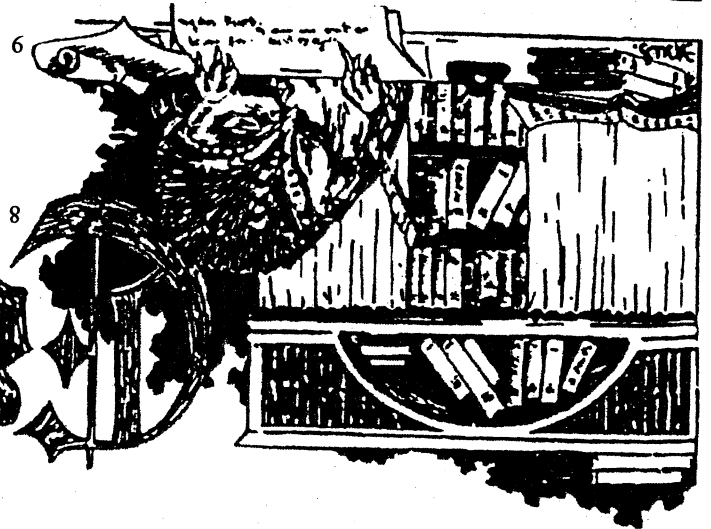
3 The article, "The Modern Age," published here in the *Record*, should have been accepted by *The New Yorker* and not rejected. We deeply regret this mistake.
